Re: Confirmed COVID-19 Cases on Cowessess First Nation

Hi, as of Friday, January 8th, there are two confirmed COVID-19 cases on Cowessess First Nation. These individuals have both confirmed that they are isolating in their homes and will remain home until they are deemed clear of COVID-19. We wish them a speedy recovery in the next few weeks and will continue to provide assistance within means necessary to help them recover. In respect of their privacy, the individual names will not be made public but I can assure you both homes have agreed to remain isolated to ensure the safety of the Community is forefront.

In the coming weeks, we have minimized any group interactions, including closure of administration offices, gatherings, and more. Staying safe at home is the best place to be during this time. Anyone experiencing symptoms must call 811 and if it is determined to get a COVID-19 test, we do have options to test on the First Nation. The Store, Water Treatment Plant and Post Office will remain open as it provides essential services. However, everyone must wear a mask and sanitize when entering and leaving.
